Stepped plantations for several weeks will allow plants to mature at different times and ensure a continuous supply of ready-to-eat birds. Sunflowers can be planted on all soil types, including deep containers, and no additional fertilization is needed. Too much fertilization can decrease seed yield by increasing stem height and leaf growth. Water the seeds every day (twice a day in very hot or dry climates) until the young plants are well established, then water thoroughly every other day. Weeds should be controlled near sunflowers when plants are very young, but once sunflowers grow several centimeters tall they will settle quickly and bad ones are no longer a concern. When stems grow taller than 3 feet, stakes may be needed to make sure they don't collapse during strong winds, storms, or when seed heads become heavy. Sunflower seeds will mature in the fall as the seed heads turn downwards and the inner flowers shrink. If you plan to store seeds to fill feeders later, you should cover your heads with a thin, sturdy mesh to prevent birds from delighting prematurely, or they can be left on the stems for birds to enjoy directly. To store the seeds, cut the flower heads of each stem to dry. When the heads are completely dry, the seeds can be rubbed to add to feeders, or dry heads can be placed on trays or platform feeders without removing the seeds.
